Journal of Cambridge Studies (ISSN: 1747-5384) is a formal quarterly registered and published in UK. It features topic-oriented, interdisciplinary dialogue, and combination of theory and practice. Main topics in the upcoming issues include "Darwin and Evolution", "In Retrospection of C. P. Snow's the Two Cultures", "University Responsibility", "Experiences Drawn from the University of Cambridge", and "Identity: the Modern Constitution of the Nation-state".

China Research Seminar Series (CRSS) specifically focuses on China-related issues. It brings together Chinese Visiting Scholars currently conducting research at Cambridge with Cambridge based non-Chinese scholars through forms of dialogue and round table discussion.
